The following are the minutes from the May 2025 meeting of the Church Council.

The minutes are available to help the entire church family stay in the know about how this group is caring for New Hope UMC!

Administrative Council Meeting Minutes - May 22, 2025

Those in attendance: Pastor HK, Becky Breeding, Alicia Copeland, Wanda Harding, Pastor Jim Harris, Linda Howdyshell, Beth Howdyshell, Bill Lalla, Laura Jenner, Corey Johnson, Susan Mehler, Bruce Rogers, Cindy Sheets, Karen Whitmer and Sandy Wyrick.

Becky Breeding called the meeting to order. Susan Mehler read a devotion on: 'Transitions' from James 4: 13-15

The minutes from the April 2025 meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Sandy Wyrick to approve the minutes as written, Susan seconded it and the motion was passed.

Staff Parish Relations Committee: (Sandy Wyrick reported)

- Pastor Jim Harris will be our interim pastor. He introduced himself to the group with a brief introduction.
- The parsonage inspection still needs to take place.

Financial Chair: (Bruce Rogers reported)

- The church audit is almost complete.
- The organ has been repaired
- Bruce recommended that we pay \$1,870 towards the Health Benefits Apportionment payment, as Cindy Deavers had recommended in her notes.
- We have over and above what we need for the windows. We may need the additional funds if there is any other damage to the window sills.

Treasurer: (report from Cindy Deavers)

- \$1000 was moved out of the non-designated funds to pay Mike Whetzel, as agreed, for use of his equipment and work he did to remove the old propane tanks.
- The total received for the window fund is \$10,870 (Easter Eggs sales was \$2,770 and donations was \$8,100)
- \$ 200 was received for Weekday Religious Education.
- The money market dividends still need to be moved to the General Fund and Cindy will do that when she records the dividends for the first quarter of 2025.
- Cindy proposed that we make an apportionment payment for the health benefits and the district as we have only made one payment this year. The total payment would be \$1,870.
- All bills have been paid to date. Payroll and benefits are left to be paid at the end of the month.

Trustees: (Corey Johnson reported)

- The date for the removal of the Suburban Propane Tank is June 12th
- The Parsonage Inspection will be conducted in mid-June with the SPRC
- Until we have a new Pastor, the church will be assuming the parsonage utility expenses
- The Parking Lot lines and curb stops have been repainted. The work was conducted by members of the congregation,
 - The remaining paint and line templates are stored in the basement for future painting.
 - United Methodist Men have graciously covered the cost of the paint which was \$203.22
- The Pasronage's metal roof above the wrap-around porch will be painted shortly. The work is to be conducted by congregation members.
- Two door openers in the Narthex have gone bad. We have purchased a replacement for one, the
 other one we are troubleshooting to see if we can repair it. The work is to be conducted by
 members of the congregations.
- All thermostats have been set to cool. Please do not adjust the thermostat to warm unless there is a sudden unforeseen drop in temperature.
- No solid date on the window installation. Possibly early July.
- The heating at the Parsonage is out. The parts are on order. In the meantime, a couple of space heaters were bought for Pastor HK and family to use.

United Methodist Sisters: (Wanda Harding reported)

- The UM Sisters will not meet in June or July.

United Methodist Men: (Bill Lalla reported)

- The UMM will not meet in June or July.
- The Cull Family Project that the UMM were working on, will be continued this Saturday, due to running out of mulch.

Lay Leader: (Susan Mehler reported)

- Attendance has been good.
- Bible Study and SHOP (Sweet Hour of Prayer) have been going well.

Communications: (report from Cindy Sheets)

After receiving 5 quotes from SVOE - Shenandoah Valley Office Equipment in Verona. We agreed that we
would get the cheapest of the options that would cost us \$83 per month to lease. The new copier/printer is
to be installed tomorrow.

Programming & Event Planning:

- Homecoming was a great success. Thank you to everyone who helped make it happen.
- Wednesday, May 28th, we will have our Community Meal starting at 5:30pm
- Wednesday, June 4th, we will have SHOP (Sweet Hour of Prayer) at 6:30pm
- Our revival will be June 6th and June 7th starting at 6:30pm. And on June 8th at 10:30am.
- June 27th, we will have our Fundraiser Meal from 5:30pm-6:30pm. The cost will be \$14. We will have tenderloin, gravy, mashed potatoes, rolls, green beans and a dessert. Carry-out will be available.
- Sunday, June 29th, we will have our next Coffee SHOP and it will also be our Farewell to Pastor HK.
- Parents Night Out will be on Friday, July 25th from 5:30pm-7:30pm. The theme will be "Christmas in July".
 Pre-registration will be required by Sunday, July 20th.

Pastor HK:

- Revival continue to grow together in Christ. Our theme is "Christ Centered Family"
- We have a new Connection Card that we can encourage any guests to fill out.

New Business:

- Bruce has been contacted by Lowe's to get an extended warranty for our new stoves. It would cost us \$240 per stove for a 3 year warranty. It was agreed by all not to extend the warranties on those new stoves.
- Cindy Sheets is aware that our website is currently down and is working to rectify that.

Becky closed the meeting and Pastor HK prayed. The meeting ended at 7:32pm.


It's hard to resist the easy.
