meeting of the Church Council.

Administrative Council Meeting Minutes - October 23, 2025

Those in attendance: Becky Breeding, Alicia Copeland, Cindy Deavers, Wanda Harding, Linda Howdyshell, Beth Howdyshell, Bill and Judy Lalla, Laura Jenner, Corey Johnson, Susan Mehler, Pastor Ashley Oliver-Thomas, Bruce Rogers, Cindy Sheets, and Karen Whitmer

Becky Breeding called the meeting to order. Corey Johnson read a devotion that he wrote based on Hebrews 10:22 - "Keeping the church healthy"

The minutes from the September 2025 meeting were reviewed. Bill Lalla made a motion to approve them, Bruce seconded it and it was approved.

Treasurer: (Cindy Deavers reported)

- All bills have been paid to date, and all giving has been reported through today.
- An apportionment payment was made last month and there will also be one paid for this month.
- Pastor Ashley and Lay Leader Susan Mehler are now on the Dupont CC account.
- Give Butter Cindy Deavers had some concerns about the logistics of this donation platform. After some additional discussion, we agreed to try it. It will cost us nothing to use this platform, as long as we enable the 'give a tip' button when we use it. The 'tips' will go to the platform itself and not to us, but we will get the full donation. We will get rid of our paypal donation link on our website.

Finance: (Bruce Rogers reported)

- The 2026 budget was approved last month. At that time we did not know that Pastor Ashley was eligible for pension monies since she is part-time. She is eligible and the budget has been updated to reflect that extra \$2,405 per year. The revisions were approved and passed and will be set to the conference.

Trustees: (Corey Johnson reported)

- Work to the A/V room and Nursery monitors has been completed. All system failures have been fixed. This included all new RF modulator and HDMI extender/splitters were replaced, and rewiring, repairing, and organizing of the wiring in the A/V room. COsts totaled: \$768.19
- A hole in the window in the A/V room was identified that allowed an obscene amount of flies into the church, particularly in the A/V room. The hole has been sealed and the room was "bug bombed" by our cleaning staff and all pests seem to be under control.
- A quote for the door repair to the stairway door has been received. Plans are to make the repairs once the new budget year begins.
- Broken windows downstairs have not been repaired yet. Awaiting a proposed date and time from the vendor.
- A door closer to the main entry door was damaged. Rocker arm was out of adjustment. The repair was made by the Trustees. While repairing the door closer it was noticed that the adjustment screws to the unit were severely out of calibration and changed from the previous settings. As a friendly reminder to members, please contact a member of the Trustees before attempting to make adjustments or repairs to church property.
- The playset has had a topical wood hardener added to the floor of the playset outside. The colors do not match but the intent is to paint the flooring once color once the hardener is in place. It is safe to use.
- The church lost hot water services on October 20th. Valley Heating Air and Plumbing was called to assess the problem. It was found that both filaments were bad in the hot water heater. They replaced the filaments after draining the system, but when recharging the system the control valve on the pressure tank failed and wouldn't allow water into the system. They replaced the control valve and charged the system only to find that the hot water heater still did not work. After further investigation, it was found that the unit's thermostat had been damaged (panel electrically bonded to the tank) from a power surge. The technicians stated that the unit needed to be replaced. After aggressive negotiations from the Trustees, the vendor agreed not to charge for any of the work because they missed the initial problem. Expressing a need to keep the repair costs as low as possible, it was agreed that if the Trustees could acquire two tanks privately that they would send them a quote to install the unit(s). Installation would most likely be next week.

United Methodist Men: (Bill Lalla reported)

- Churchwide cleanup was very successful. Thanks to all who showed up. We accomplished pruning, trimming of overhanging branches, picking up debris, and spreading a trailer load of mulch.
- The playground was evaluated and nails were hammered down, a coating was put on the deck, weeds were pulled and the swing area had gravel put back in place.

- The community meal was a blessing. We were able to serve about 85 people while learning about community needs. The men provided hot dogs, hamburgers, drinks and ice. In addition we cooked the hamburgers and assisted with cleaning up.

- The excess food was taken to First Step, the shelter for those who have been victims of domestic violence. They were very grateful for the donations.

New Business

- We have a workday scheduled for Saturday, November 1 at Steven Cull's residence. If we have enough help we should be done before noon.
- As we have done in past years, I suggested we skip the December meeting as it falls during all the Christmas festivities..accepted..
- Since November will be our last meeting, we will be thinking about nominations for 2026.

- On September 26th, we will have our 50's Diner


Charge Conference:



Leftovers

At the risk of appearing snobbish or ungrateful, I've got a confession to make: I don't like leftovers, i.e. cold food that is in need of being reheated. I always have the best of intentions to pull last night's meal out of the refrigerator, throw it in the microwave, nuke it, and consume it, but I fail to do so time and time again. Now, don't get me wrong. I've eaten my fair share of leftovers, but I can't honestly say that I enjoy eating leftovers. The food never seems to taste or look the same. It lacks something.

With respect to your Christian walk, do you realize that God is not interested in your leftovers?

In fact, Jesus says that we are to "seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness" (Matt. 6:33, emphasis added). Among other things, this means that God should come first in every aspect of our lives. Indeed, we should NOT give God our leftover love (Matt. 22:37-38), time (Eph. 5:18), thoughts (Phil. 4:8), service (Gal. 5:13-14), or money (Prov. 3:9; 1 Cor. 16:2; 2 Cor. 8-9). In the mind of God, such leftovers lack something.




Being content with giving God the leftovers reveals something about the person who has this attitude. John said, "We love because He first loved us" (1 John 4:9, emphasis added). God loved us all so much in the midst of our sin that He took the initiative by sending His Son into the world to die in our place (John 3:16; Rom. 5:8). God gave us His very best; in return, He expects the same. Indeed, contentment in giving God the leftovers exposes an ungrateful, selfish attitude.

Leftovers are fine when it comes to nourishing our physical bodies. At times, leftovers are unavoidable, even necessary. However, with respect to God and our spirituality, a life of leftovers is unacceptable, especially when we take into account the example of His Son (cf. Phil. 2:5-11).
