From Pastor Mike

I am so thankful that God sent me to serve with you as your pastor almost 2 ½ years ago. It is a privilege I do not take for granted. I continue to be amazed at the strong lay leadership and the adaptability of the fine people who make up the congregation of New Hope United Methodist Church. When a need is discovered, this congregation calls upon God to find a way.

My heart was lifted once again after the Sunday, November 28th worship service. Alicia Copeland, our music director, came up with a very ambitious plan for music during Advent and Christmas. I was concerned that we may not have enough volunteers. We needed adults and children to sing and ring bells during Advent and Christmas Eve services.

One challenge we face at New Hope brought on by the pandemic is the ability to recruit volunteers. I was concerned that it may have been too much to ask, and the need seemed great. So, the call went out for volunteers and the response was amazing. The children practiced their songs during Kids R.O.C.K. A newly formed bell choir held a brief practice after worship. And people agreed to sing in the special Christmas Choir and took their sheet music home to practice.

The pandemic has forced us to do things differently which requires flexibility. Much time has been spent in prayer as we try to respond to COVID-19 in a responsible manner. The emotional toil brought on by the pandemic is real, but I believe we are trying to adjust and move forward as best we can. The enthusiasm I witnessed on the faces of the bell ringers and choir volunteers tells me we desperately need and want Advent and Christmas.

Another challenge is the need to reconnect with those who have not returned to online or in-person worship. While I have spent the past year reaching out to people over the telephone or through the mail, I am sure there are some who may feel neglected or overlooked. If you feel disconnected from your church family, I hope you will reach out to your pastor or a church friend.

Finally, since Christmas Eve is on a Friday this year and I think many families are eager to spend that night together. So, we will have a 4:00pm Christmas Eve service which should allow everyone to be home in plenty of time for Christmas Eve dinners and gift exchanges. I hope you will join us on Christmas Eve and bring your children and grandchildren. Look for more details about this service in the newsletter.

My prayer for the Church and each other during this Advent and Christmas season is that we will rediscover the joy of celebrating Christmas together again – whether virtual or in person.

Let us heed the words of King David and draw near to God. When the peace of Christ rules in our hearts, thankfulness overflows. Even in the darkest of times, we can praise God for his love, his sovereignty, and his promise to be near us when we call.


